LIVING WITH REGRETS

My freshman year in college I lived in Sewell Hall, a men's dorm at David Lipscomb College. A year or two before I arrived, there had been a tragedy just down the hall from the room on third floor where I lived. It was just one of those foolish dormitory shenanigans: A young man threw a Coke bottle, hard, down the hall. Another young man put his head out the door at the wrong moment, was struck in the temple, and died instantly. What would it be like to live with grief and guilt and regret like that?

By God's grace I have lived my life under God's protection, so I have no huge regrets. The regrets that I do have are mostly just little dumb things I said or did without lasting consequences beyond embarrassment.

My one big regret is the fact that in the final years of my Dad's life I did not treat him with greater respect and did not spend much time or attention on him. I was too busy. I had a young family. I was doing other important things, so I neglected my Dad. My last memory of him alive is seeing him in the side mirror of the Ryder truck as I pulled it out to move our family from Oregon to Minnesota to do the PhD. Dad stood there on the sidewalk, no doubt knowing he was dying of lung cancer, and he watched me take his grandchildren away. Nine months later he died. The fact that I was that clueless toward Dad is my greatest regret.

I share my story because I know you have your own stories. You too live with some grief and guilt and regret. How can we forgive ourselves and be at peace with the memories that gnaw at us?

Jesus says to pray, "Forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors." Then he says, "For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins" (Mt 6:12-15). The key to receiving God's forgiveness is to become forgiving persons, says Jesus. The key to forgiving ourselves is to live in God's forgiveness. The more we live in forgiveness toward others, the more we will also feel it and know it toward ourselves.

I can't say I'm totally at peace with my regrets toward Dad. Once in a while I'll have a dream with Dad in it, where I actually get to say to him the words I didn't know I needed to say while he was alive. I tell him that I love him, that I know and understand him better now, that I've learned to respect and honor him, that I need him to forgive me. And he does.

Much of my problem back then was youth and arrogance and foolishness. I was such a child! As I've grown up in Christ, I've grown in God's love and in his wisdom and understanding, so now I see with clearer vision what back then I was too clueless to see. I take some comfort in the words of I Corinthians 13: "When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known."

My dreams tell me that Dad is still on my heart. My hope in Christ tells me that in the restoration of all things, the Father will set everything right. Doesn't that mean that when we see Jesus face to face we will be fully and finally reconciled, not only with God, but also with our loved ones? It is then that we will finally and fully be freed from our unreconciled regrets.
